Literacy Central Vancouver Island

Literacy Central Vancouver Island (LCVI) was incorporated in March 1990 as a community-based, nonprofit, registered charity. Its purpose is *to promote literacy for all individuals*. Its mandate, as originally defined, is purposefully very broad:

- To determine the needs of the community and to work within the frameworks of existing literacy programs to increase accessibility and participation.
- To provide a highly visible, easily accessed learning centre.
- To recruit and train volunteer tutors.
- To recruit literacy learners.
- To match volunteer tutors with learners and provide support and ongoing assessment of learners' progress.

The volunteer tutor program assists learners who wish to improve their reading, writing, math or computer skills. Community volunteers with teaching credentials and experience are asked to commit a minimum of three hours per week for tutoring for a minimum of six months. Tutor Coordinators work with adults, youth and family from Ladysmith to Nanoose, including Snaw-Naw-As, Snuneymuxw, and Stz'uminus Nations, Nanaimo Corrections Centre and other outreach locations, as well as walk-ins.

Literacy Centrals' **computer refurbishing program** welcomes donations of used laptops, parts and software from Individuals, organizations and companies in the Nanaimo area.

Literacy Central Vancouver Island cont.

A long-time volunteer has set up an amazing workshop downstairs where he takes the computers apart and refurbishes them. These are then donated to families and individuals who otherwise could not afford them.

The distribution of the computers is managed through community agencies. Teachers and/or community workers identify families and individuals they feel would benefit from having a computer in their home and they make the request to Literacy Central VI. Since 1999, Literacy Central Vancouver Island has distributed more than **2500** computers!

A popular destination for booklovers is Literacy Central's **Well Read Books**. Opening in 1994, this used bookstore is a steady source of revenue for LCVI. The store is staffed by many volunteers who generously donate their time and energy. All books are donated by individuals in our community and many are collected by Rotarians from the book bins around Nanaimo. The store has proved to be more than just a source of revenue. Situated in downtown Nanaimo, it is highly visible. Staff and volunteers are friendly and helpful, often the first contact for individuals with low literacy skills.

Many books are donated to other area agencies such as schools, our First Nation communities, the free little library bookcases around town and to service agencies.

Without the support of our Volunteer Tutors, Bookstore Volunteers, our Volunteer Computer Refurbisher, and Volunteer Board of Directors, our organization would not exist. Our volunteers contribute many hours of support to Literacy Central and we are so very grateful for their dedication and commitment.

Volunteer Nanaimo Youth Making a Difference!





In October, members created a Thanksgiving board, volunteered at an NAC group home yard clean up, fed the homeless, and contributed their time at the Foodshare farm. We also sponsored a 'Halloween for Hunger' event and collected non-perishable food for Loaves & Fishes. We teamed up with local Katimavik members and held a Food Forestry/Signs of Hope painting event at Bayview Elementary School. Members also participated in the VIU Food Security online event and in a virtual painting night.
