Member of the Month PacificCARE Family Enrichment Society

PacificCARE Family Enrichment Society (PCFES) covers a large area of Vancouver Island, spanning Ladysmith all the way north to the Tri-Port area, and Tofino/Ucluelet to Powell River. You'll find our head office in Nanaimo and our satellite office in the Comox Valley. There are also outlying offices in Oceanside (Qualicum), Port Alberni, and Campbell River.

In 1990, PacificCARE was awarded the Child Care Resource and Referral (CCRR) contract that is currently funded by the Ministry of Education and Child Care, which works in partnership with government to improve the accessibility, affordability, and quality of child care in communities across the province.

CCRRs help to connect our families with the early years and child care services they need such as:

- referrals to child care providers and community services
- access to quality resources
- lending libraries (toys and resources)
- Parent Child Mother Goose programs.
- child care referrals.
- drop-in play groups.
- support in applying for the Affordable Child Care Benefit (ACCB).

CCRRs provide support services and consultations to child care providers to foster quality inclusive care through services such as:

- workshops and training
- networking opportunities
- supportive program outreach
- access to lending libraries
- referrals to community resources
- support License-Not-Required child care providers in becoming registered by offering training and additional support through the process
- Responsible Adult course for those wanting to enter the child care field.



PacificCARE Family Enrichment Society values its relationship with our community partners throughout our area to provide services to both families and our childcare providers. Together with our community partners we are able to offer our families and care providers:

- workshops
- partnering in story walks
- books for newborns
- literacy support for children
- sharing of resources
- information and support on child development
- opportunities for families to connect with each other
- early year fairs.
