## Member of the Month: Global Village



In 1998, we were all learning to enjoy slow cooker meals and starting to drink Red Bull. The minimum wage in BC was \$7.15, the Nanaimo Daily News published its last edition, and the Google Search Engine was founded.

This was also the year Global Village
Nanaimo opened its first Christmas Pop-Up store.
Since then, our seasonal store has sprung up in
various locations, including downtown, Commercial
Street, Metral Crossing, Longwood Station, Rock City
Centre, West-Hills Town Centre, Nored Plaza, plus
locations within the Old City Quarter. More recently,
we launched a year-round online store, and for the
past seven years, pop-op stores open each May to
celebrate Fair Trade Month. These spring stores are
often in Nanaimo North Town Centre or Country
Club Centre.

The team of volunteers who make the store a pleasant, comfortable place to shop and our leaders who have contributed to the board of directors over the years have been essential to the success of this non-profit store. Their flexibility, their commitment, their willingness to share what they know about fair trade, and their positive attitude through a kazillion changes have created a very strong organization. Several of the volunteers and most customers have actively supported Global Village over the years, as others are just becoming acquainted with Fair Trade more recently.

Through it all, Global Village has worked hard to keep the product assortment fresh and interesting for customers while supporting fair trade artisans. These are artisans who have never been to Canada, so have a tough time knowing our tastes, preferences and needs. This has created a beautiful working relationship in which their unique skills and cultural traditions are combined with practical, useful products that appeal to us in Western Canada.

Many people are starting to notice that almost everything imported by Global Village Nanaimo has a practical use. This is becoming important to our customers, particularly as many of us are becoming more intentional with our spending.

Now is an important time for ethical businesses like Global Village Nanaimo - it's as though the impact of fair trade is being shouted around the globe all the way from Nanaimo!


